Coventry has been home to the British bicycle, motorcycle and car industries since the 19th century, with Jaguar, Armstrong Siddeley, Alvis, Hillman, Chrysler, Triumph, Singer, Humber, Lanchester and Rover all manufacturing cars from this city. Most of these famous names have now gone, but Jaguar Land Rover and Aston Martin still manufacture in this automotive heartland. Aside from cars, Warwickshire has fine country houses and castles. Stratford upon Avon, home to Shakespeare, and Warwick Castle are just two places well worth a visit.

The centrepiece of the Treffen will be at Coventry Transport Museum, located in the city centre, where our cars will be displayed at Millennium Place in front of the museum. Notable exhibits in the museum are Thrust2 and ThrustSSC, the British jet cars which broke the land speed record in 1983 and 1997, respectively, and some of the Royal cars - Queen Mary's and King George V's State limousines. The museum has one of the finest and largest collection of vehicles in the world, with 120 motorcycles, 300 cycles, 250 cars and commercial vehicles of the last 150 years. The museum will play host to our annual international chairmen's meeting and of course our Olympic games.



As well as the museum, Coventry has plenty of history to take in, such as the beautiful St Mary's Guildhall and Coventry Cathedral.
